Higher Education: Language Sessions



Overview:

In collaboration with the Middle East Institute at Columbia University, NaTakallam enriches Arabic and Persian courses, giving students immersive language practice with native speakers.

Our Collaboration:

Integrated Learning:

Arabic professors use NaTakallam for dialect exposure, while instructors incorporate it into coursework assignment support and communication practice.

Open Fund Partnership:

Through Columbia's Middle East Institute (MEI), students can apply for independent language sessions, designed to complement their studies.

Syllabus-Backed Sessions:

NaTakallam sessions are officially part of course syllabi and required for final grades

Impact:

500+ Sessions and Growing:

Students engage in Arabic (Egyptian, Palestinian, Syrian, Lebanese, & Modern Standard Arabic) and Persian (Farsi, Dari) with native-speaking Language Partners.

Higher Education: Curriculum Integration



Center for Contemporary Arab Studies

Overview:

Since 2021, Georgetown University's Center for Contemporary Arab Studies (CCAS) has partnered with NaTakallam to provide language learning scholarships for university students, K-12 educators, and non-profits like Teens of Color Abroad (TOCA).

Our Collaboration:

Through Georgetown and NaTakallam's Collaboration:

- University students receive semester-based scholarships for conversational practice & cultural exchange, with NaTakallam sessions integrated into their curricula.
- K-12 educators receive scholarships to improve their Arabic teaching through immersive sessions.
- Non-profits (e.g., TOCA) receive scholarships to fund underprivileged students' language learning, expanding community access.




Higher Education: Cross-Border Conversations



Overview:

At the **University of South Florida**, **NaTakallam** is integrated into the *International Human Rights and Migration* course since 2019.



Our Collaboration:

Students connect with individuals from countries like **Venezuela**, **Nicaragua**, **DRC**, **Burundi**, **Afghanistan**, **and Syria** to hear firsthand accounts of migration and displacement.

Enhancing Global Awareness

Students gain personal insights into the experiences of forcibly displaced individuals, and gain deeper understanding of global migration issues and their human impact.

Curriculum Integration

Students interview Language Partners in English about their migration experiences and produce reports on their findings as part of their course curriculum.

NaTakallam's partnership with USF is featured in the **Journal of Intercultural Education**, showcasing the impact of **NaTakallam's** services at the university.

Higher Education: Refugee Voices Sessions



Overview:

NaTakallam's Refugee Voices sessions offer universities the flexibility to choose a theme, connecting them to a refugee whose personal story aligns with the topic.

Your Theme, Their Story

You pick the subject, and we match you with a refugee who brings authentic experience to the conversation.

Real-Life Perspectives

Sessions are centered around sharing the lived experiences of refugees, providing a deeper connection to academic content.

Our Collaboration:

At the **University of Pennsylvania**, professors understand how the arts, music, literature, and more, shape the refugee experience, particularly during protest and displacement.

Summer program students interacted with a refugee, learning how the arts shaped their life in Syria and through displacement.

Students gained a deeper appreciation for how creative expression serves as both resistance and survival.
